## **NEED FOR THE RULE(S)**

Oregon Administrative Rules establishing seasons and permit numbers for 2025 controlled sage-grouse hunts were adopted by the Commission on April 18, 2025. Permit numbers adopted at that time did not account for ongoing and incomplete sage-grouse population surveys which potentially reflect population changes resulting from habitat impacts from 2024 wildfires and weather patterns. This rule amendment is necessary to adjust permit numbers in some sage-grouse hunt areas to account for changes to sage-grouse population (e.g., lower populations in some areas and higher populations in other areas) estimates resulting from data collected in the surveys completed after permit numbers were adopted. Analysis of population surveys is ongoing and final staff proposals for changes to sage-grouse permit numbers will be available approximately August 1, 2025.

## STATEMENT IDENTIFYING HOW ADOPTION OF RULE(S) WILL AFFECT RACIAL EQUITY IN THIS STATE

#### FISCAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT:

Amendment adjusts permit numbers in some sage-grouse hunt areas to account for unanticipated changes to sage-grouse population. There is a potential for some modest shifts in hunting effort geographically in response to changes in the number of controlled hunts available in each hunt area. The majority of effected units (6 of 8) will have additional permits available because of the amendment.

Fiscal and economic impacts discussed in this document pertain only to the proposed rules at the time of writing of this fiscal impact statement.

State agencies that could be affected by rules relating to sage-grouse permits are the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) for wildlife management costs and the Oregon State Police (OSP) for enforcement costs. While ODFW does not expect any significant changes to expenditures as a result of the changes there may be an increase or decrease in the number of controlled hunt permits that will now be available due to changes to the sage-grouse population.

No units of local government are expected to be affected by these rules. No significant changes from the current levels of any local agencies' operations or expenditures are expected because of the revised permit numbers.

The public is affected by rules relating to game bird hunting seasons. Various sectors of the public economy (hunters, suppliers of hunting equipment, and the general economy) can experience different impacts, though no significant impacts are expected to result from the proposed rule updates. There could be minor changes in hunter participation and effort for controlled sage-grouse hunts occurring in the 2025 season as permits numbers for some hunt areas may increase while others may decrease.

(2) Effect on Small Businesses: (a) Estimate the number and type of small businesses subject to the rule(s); The types of businesses that have potential to be affected are those that supply goods or services to bird hunters. These may include taxidermy services, hunting guides, private hunting preserve operators, food and beverage stores, gasoline

stations, sporting goods stores, general merchandise stores, accommodation businesses, food services and drinking places. The number of small businesses that could be impacted by shifts in sage-grouse hunter participation and effort cannot be estimated.

(b) Describe the expected reporting, recordkeeping and administrative activities and cost required to comply with the rule(s):

## WAS AN ADMINISTRATIVE RULE ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONSULTED? NO IF NOT, WHY NOT?

No, this rule was reviewed by Wildlife Division administration. This rule adjusts the existing permit numbers to incorporate the newest scientific findings related to sage-grouse populations in Oregon. Correspondence from and testimony by interested and affected persons is accepted into record as part of the rulemaking process.

AMEND: 635-053-0000

RULE SUMMARY: Changes in habitat conditions due to 2024 wildfires and analysis of sage-grouse survey data collected during spring 2025 necessitate a modification of sage-grouse hunting permits for the 2025 hunting season. Sage-grouse are a species of upland game bird with the number of controlled hunting permits available for each sage-grouse hunt area adopted by the Fish and Wildlife Commission (Commission) at their April 18, 2025 meeting and printed in the "2024-25 Oregon Game Bird Hunting Regulations." This rulemaking is necessary to modify the permit numbers because OAR 635-053-0000 states in part that restrictions for 2025 upland game bird hunting are described in the "2024-2025 Oregon Game Bird Hunting Regulations" and are adopted and incorporated into OAR Chapter 635, by reference.

## **CHANGES TO RULE:**

635-053-0000 Purpose ¶

- (1) The purpose of these rules is to establish season dates, bag limits, areas and other restrictions for hunting upland game birds pursuant to ORS Chapter 496.¶
- (2) The document entitled "2025-2026 Oregon Game Bird Hunting Regulations," is incorporated by reference into these rules.  $\P$
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of the 2025-26 Oregon Game Bird Hunting Regulations, the 2024 Sage-grouse controlled hunt permit numbers for the controlled hunt areas listed on page 21 and Table 1 (see attached table) are as follows:¶
