More harvest opportunity

- Increased annual bag limit in several basins (2 to 3)
- Projected 33% increase in harvest



Conservation concerns in Umpqua

- 2022 had very low return, no fish observed in South Umpqua
- Environmental fire impacts, warming water, predation
