Upcoming fishing regulations meeting

Dear odfw this is my testimony on rule changes for the lower clackamas river, from pge fish trap at cazadero dam down to the mouth of the clackamas.

My name is Kenneth, and I have been fishing the clackamas with my dad since I was 5, and the surrounding lakes.

First regulation change that needs to be changed is, the open trout season on the lower clackamas, it used to never be open for trout season at all, and there were bigger and better returns, for hatchery salmon and steelhead returns. Since the opening of trout fishing on the lower clackamas the runs have been a lot smaller of returning fish, and the regulations state no (minimum length) meaning if you catch a 3 inch fish you can keep it, and there is a maximum of 18 inches and anything under 18 inches is considered a trout which I and other anglers feel you guys are biased towards hatchery fish, due to not having counts of bycatch for salmon and steelhead smolts, also not having any counts of people targeting trout and catching smolts and keeping them, plus the predators who feed on the smolts, all the birds feeding on all the smolts at clackamas fish hatchery, which someone finally recognized there is a serious bird problem, also they not just have to survive birds, fisherman, but also pike minnows, this is also a waste of taxpayers money with the smolts and absolutely no protection on the lower clackamas, and the pge fish counts and hatchery counts prove it I asked for the smolt numbers, from 2,000 till present day 2025 and a serious decline in smolts, also some of the smolts stick around for an extra year because that is what they do naturally is stay in a river system for 2 years before heading to the ocean are you denying them their natural way, also steelhead can go back to the ocean up to 3 times or more to re spawn are you denying their natural way of spawning, also the more hatchery salmon and steelhead the more likely the sea lions, which we now call them river lions, will get a hatchery fish and not a wild fish, which wild fish especially salmon and steelhead a lot of them were raised in a hatchery and not clipped, and let go in an acclimation pond in a river then let go. Second change is the 3 fish limit on the clackamas for hatchery salmon and steelhead down to 2 hatchery salmon or steelhead, there are a lot of bank fisherman out there missing out especially fishing from Barton Park, McKiver park, and from river mill to cazadero dam, there isn't hardly much fish left up that way and those are the best bank spots but there's hardly any fish and with all the decline in hatchery smolts it makes it even worse, especially spending the money on a license and tag, I can't fish much anymore due to having some disabilities and I could get a handicap endorsement but what's the point of spending all that money on a license and tag just to watch my friends who can fish and take me same with my son, catch no fish because of the poor returns and the 3 fish limit, and I can go to those places but hardly no fish, so how is that fair because by the time they get up river that far it's fished out, also McKiver side estacada lake has a handicapped dock that I used to see people catch salmon and steelhead all the time, but not anymore, are you denying handicapped people the

opportunity to fish for hatchery salmon and steelhead off that dock anymore, because the counts at pge fish counts at cazadero dam are horrible, they used to have so much hatchery fish they would put them in Faraday lake, hole punch the gill plate and recycle them down stream, plus u could also donate the hatchery fish to food banks to help hungry people and use it as a tax write off. the fish trap above carver park in a creek needs to b shut down, it's been a complete waste of taxpayers dollars especially the cost, and I mean all the costs the yearly cost to, it would save the taxpayers money just to release that small amount of fish from the clackamas hatchery and no longer use the one right above carver park
