I would be an excellent choice for R&E membership because I have a wide breadth of experience with sport fishing both on the ocean and inland. I served on ODFW STAC for 8 years where I provided organization and responsible progress reporting for the group, provided positive, critical review of the beta version of the then proposed automated fishing licensing program, and made financial disbursement decisions totaling several hundred thousand over two terms. I travelled to a wide variety of Fisheries throughout the State and am aware of many of the challenges which exist.

I believe I can work through conflicting priorities and have often been challenged with such situations.

I can and am willing to support R&E travel and remotely work as needed.

Within Gardiner Reedsport Winchester Bay STEP (GRWB) I have served as a member and on the Board of Directors for over 8 years. Served as Treasurer for two years and directly participated in acquiring funds, prizes, weigh-ins, and award programs. Also participated in acquisition of critical hatchery equipment, decisions to improve the only Fall Chinook hatchery on the Lower Umpqua River, and assisted in smolt containment net set-up in Winchester Bay.

In Florence STEP, my contributions have included serving on the Board of Directors as Director of Education. As a member, I performed a wide variety of activities including Whittaker Creek installation of the only Steelhead processing trap on the Siuslaw River, egg-taking, smolt acclimation, release and reporting. I created a highly praised Steelhead dissection event for Florence and Mapleton grade school grades 1-4. I also directly participated in the acquisition of a suitable building, activation of a conversion contractor, and integrating confederated tribal, high school, and STEP initiatives including the raising of over \$30,000. Additionally, I managed Preparation and annual delivery of 22 classroom Egg to Fry aquariums, followed by management of the fish release into local waters.

Over the years, I also helped establish the Longview Hills Fishing Club, participating in their fund-raising efforts and certified many of their members as Certified Angler Instructors, and participate in their saltwater fishing events. As an ODFW Certified Angler Instructor, I have conducted classes for the Longview Hills Fishing Club, GRWB STEP, and provided hundreds of students with terminal tackle preparation, casting and fishing ethics instruction. I also provided two years of fishing instruction to recreational groups at Honeyman State Park.

In my community,, I annually serve as a volunteer Alternative Energy judge for student competition at the OSU Sea Grant event. As an interested citizen I attend the annual OSU State of the Coast Conference, and I have served on the local Board of Directors of the Heceta South HOA.

I've retired from the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) after 30 years as both a Law Enforcement Officer and a Consumer Advocate. I know and understand the workings of state regulatory agencies and I can comfortably place myself in a consumer's shoes on the other side of that picture.

I believe my background satisfies the requirements necessary for this position and for someone like myself who enjoys being involved in any and every part of the process that ultimately affects the habitat or life of a species like our salmon which is so important to all of us!

As a retiree, for many years I've enjoyed spending many hours volunteering my free time with Christine Clapp, Fisheries Biologist, out of Newport who is with Oregon's Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) in its Salmon and Trout Enhancement Program (STEP). Where we monitor salmon at the Scooner Creek fish trap, monitor salmon at the Salmon River fish trap, perform restoration activities to rivers habitat to better support and protect salmon, provide aquariums and salmon fry at many local schools, libraries and public meeting locations and where we meet with classroom children weekly educating them on a salmon's life and journey.

I've belonged to Longview Hills Fishing Club (LHFC) for many years where as club members we not only volunteer our time with ODFW but many other fishing related organizations as well. We've preformed river cleanups where we remove debris from the banks and waterways with UDaMan Fishing Club.

LHFC is a sponsor to, and club members volunteer for, the C.A.S.T. For Kids Foundation (Catch A Special Thrill). C.A.S.T. provides fishing and crabbing opportunities here annually in Newport for special needs children.

I am also a continuing volunteer fisherman for Oregon's Marine Reserves Hook-and-Line Sampling where we fish specific protected marine reserves to survey specific types of salt water fish in their natural habitat.

I have also volunteered for several years for Oregon State University (OSU) providing water samples for their Cooperative Fisheries Projects. OSU publishes the data they collect from reviewing and testing water samples taken from various locations out in the ocean. This newsletter details the life supporting organisms for marine life in the water in their newsletter publications.

Good fish management is essential in today's fishing environment! Doesn't matter if you're talking about salt water fish or fresh water fish. You can't be promoting the growth of fishermen if you're not providing them the fish to fish for.

My earliest memories are of fishing. I don't remember learning, just knowing how to bait my hook, cast my line, and clean my fish. My parents also taught me angling ethics: no fish was harvested unless it was destined for the dinner table; and any fish harvested was dispatched quickly, so as not to suffer. I have continued to be an avid sport angler and have lived by these angling ethics ever since. This early introduction to fish also led me to become a Fish Biologist for 35 years.

As a Fish Biologist and an avid sport angler, I can bring a combined perspective to the R&E Board. I also have knowledge and experience of being a successful applicant for a R&E grant award. My aspiration to serve on the R&E Board is because I want to use my knowledge and experience to improve fishing opportunities for all sport anglers. Although my career as a Fish Biologist focused primarily on salmon and trout, I also enjoy angling for warmwater fish. While I certainly acknowledge the detrimental effects that warmwater fish have had on some salmon and trout populations, I also recognize there are places where warmwater sport fish can provide angling opportunities without harming native fish.

I am very good at working with people I may not agree with on certain issues. When I was working for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, I collaborated with many landowners on fish habitat restoration projects. I didn't care what political sign was in their driveway or bumper sticker on their car, if they wanted to do good things for the fish, I would work with them. The fish didn't care, and they needed help, so I would focus on what the landowner and I did have in common; we both wanted to do good things for the fish and wildlife on their land.

I find it distressing that sport and commercial anglers tend to be at odds with each other. The fish don't need this; they need everyone who cares about fish to work together on issues such as quality habitat and adequate instream water. While it may be easy for someone to blame commercial fisheries for low salmon populations, I know these fisheries are highly regulated. They also provide economic support for coastal communities. As a member of the R&E Board, I look forward to working with the commercial fishing representative on finding common ground and solutions to improving fish habitats in Oregon.

In my 35-year career as a Fish Biologist, I have served on five review committees with varied and diverse members representing different perspectives on environmental issues. This experience has given me the opportunity to work through differences in a respectful and professional manner.

When I worked as a Salmon Trout Enhancement Program Biologist, I received two R&E grant awards. The first award was for a fishing platform at Adair Pond with an ADA compliant trail to the platform. By using volunteers to build the trail and platform, I had enough remaining funds to also build a picnic shelter. The second grant was to stockpile trees for instream fish habitat projects when the trees were available, then provide the trees to watershed councils during the in-water-work periods. By obtaining and administering these grants, I have the knowledge and experience of being an applicant.

Also, while working as a STEP Biologist, I assisted several watershed councils in my district with applications for R&E Grants including technical advice on their projects and application review.

For 15 years, while working for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), I was a member of the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB) Region 3 Review Team. In addition to the OWEB Region 3 Review Team, I was also on the review committee for Small Landowner Grants.

From June 2023 until May of 2025, I served on the Northwest Forest Plan Amendment Federal Advisory Committee (FAC). I worked with the Forest Service Region 5 and 6 staff, the planning team, and the other 20 members of the FAC to develop amendments to the Northwest Forest Plan. The FAC also assisted Forest Service staff with the draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Northwest Forest Plan Amendment.

For 10 years, I was the Chair of the Oregon Chapter American Fisheries Society Education and Outreach Committee (EO Committee). As chair of the EO Committee, I administered the Educators Grant award which allocates funds to teachers and other educators for projects that teach children about fish.

The biggest issue fish face in Oregon is water. Enough water. Good quality water. There are too many demands on instream water with many creeks over allocated to water rights. Fish need water, it really is that simple. But solutions are very complex and complicated. R&E can play a crucial role in finding solutions to this very simple, yet very complicated issue. For example, instream habitat project funded by the R&E Board provides cool water pools around log jams, increasing summer habitats. Funding fish passage projects allows salmon and trout to reach cool water refugia areas.

Another issue is the lack of connection between fish and people. Fish don't have a fish problem; they have a people problem. You can not expect someone who doesn't care about fish to care about fish. This is why education and outreach were a major part of my work as the Salmon Trout Enhancement Program Biologist with ODFW. Any way to connect people to fish will help fish. Education projects funded by R&E can help provide this connection through funding for the Salmon Trout Advisory Committee's grant program and with angler outreach programs. Not all children have the fortune to grow up in a fishing family like I did. This is why I am an ODFW Angler Education Instructor.

Projects that I have personally organized include; Christmas Trees for Salmon (eight years of gathering Christmas Trees and placing them in local creeks with help from local high school students), organized and taught a fishing class for the Reedsport High School, cleared areas on the North Bank of Lake Marie for angler access, for the last eight years organized the OCA Banquet that funds the OCA, developed and manage the OCA Conservation Scholarship (\$5,000 annually to high school student from Florence to Brookings), contacted high school teachers within a field trip distance from the Charleston Marine Life Center to pay for their expenses to visit the CMLC. I am a member of the Florence STEP, Gardiner STEP, Morgan Creek STEP and the Oregon South Coast Fishermen STEP. I am a member of the ODFW Sport Anglers Council. I participate in the Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia angler and scientist roundtable meetings. I am a member of the Groundfish Advisory Panel to the Pacific Fishery Management Council. Regarding the PPMC, I have an active Angler Science Pilot Program in place.

There are fish management issues almost every where you look. Salmon are in decline for many reasons, loss of habitat, warm water ocean conditions, hatchery management and in some cases over fishing. I focus some of my effort influencing hatchery management. A major issue in hatcheries is releasing pre-smolts largely due to poor water conditions at the hatchery. Eggs are transported from one hatchery to another with colder water, reared to smolts, shipped back for acclimation and released. There is some question regarding impacts to the homing instincts of salmon shipped in this manner. Only a fraction of the fish get this treatment the rest are released as pre-smolts.

Smolts have a much better survival rate than pre-smolts. I am actively engaged in acquiring a chiller for the Gardiner Hatchery to improve water quality, so they can raise more smolt sized Fall Chinook. Perhaps we could avoid future fishing closures of the Umpqua River. The R & E Board could help with a focused program to put chillers in hatcherys that would benefit.

ODFW ocean bottomfish regulations are based largely on Black Rockfish. The last PFMC assessment for Black Rockfish (and Canary Rockfish) caused a significant reduction in near shore fishing opportunity, both for recreation and commercial anglers. Assessments for near shore bottomfish are constrained by available data. I started an Angler Science pilot program this year that will provide new data regarding angler observations and catch and release information. the R & E Board could assist in advancing the development of Angler Science.
