Area Regulations:

- Hunting access by permission only
- Motorized vehicle travel only on open roads
- No camping or night-time use of private land
- No fires, be careful with cigarettes
- No littering, pick up any trash
- Report unlawful activities
- Respect landowners rights and needs
- Leave all gates as you found them
- No shooting within 150 yards of houses or barns

New River Access Area



The New River Access Area is a cooperative program between several private landowners and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Access and Habitat Program to maintain public hunting access on private lands and increase access to public land. The New River Access Area south of Bandon, OR provides public hunting opportunities for waterfowl. All Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Regulations and Seasons apply.

Consult Game Bird Regulations for duck and goose open season dates

Access Permission:

Hunters must obtain permission prior to hunting on the property. Fill out ODFW hunter harvest cards at kiosks. Permission can be obtained by contacting the landowner by phone at the following numbers. Reservations will be booked on a first come, first served basis. Land-owners reserve the right to refuse permission and close areas due to normal ranch operations. Up to 6 hunters per zone per day, unless otherwise permitted by the landowner."



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
