On Friday, **May 15, 2026, at 8:30 AM, Chair Wahl called the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission** (the Commission) meeting to order.

DIRECTOR’S REPORT

Adopt Temporary Rules

The Commission ratify the following temporary rules. The six (6) temporary rules were previously adopted by the director under her emergency action authority.

1.) 635-017-0090
Modify Willamette Falls Lamprey Harvest Regulations
Adopted: 5/8/2026 Effective Dates: 6/1/2026 through 7/31/2026
This amended rule modifies the harvest regulations for the Pacific lamprey fishery at Willamette Falls.

2.) 635-019-0520
Open Hatchery Chinook Salmon Angling in Lookingglass Creek
Adopted: 5/11/2026 Effective Dates: 5/15/2026 through 6/14/2026
This amended rule allows recreational harvest of hatchery Chinook in Lookingglass Creek from May 15 through June 14, 2026.

1 3.) 635-004-0275

2 Federal Actions Implemented for Commercial Groundfish Fisheries

3 Adopted: 5/11/2026 Effective Dates: 5/11/2026 through 11/6/2026

4 This amended rule adopts in-season changes previously adopted by the federal government
5 for 2026 Pacific Coast Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access commercial groundfish
6 fisheries, including, but not limited to, catch limit increases for canary rockfish.

8 4.) 635-004-0085

9 2026 Pacific Halibut All-depth Seasons Federal References Corrections

10 Adopted: 5/11/2026 Effective Dates: 5/12/2026 through 10/31/2026

11 The proposed rule amendment regulates the 2026 recreational Pacific halibut fishery by
12 establishing seasons and quotas for Oregon state-water fisheries, ensuring and promoting
13 consistency with federally adopted regulations, and incorporating housekeeping and
14 technical updates. This amendment incorporates federal regulations that were not available
15 at the time of the original filing and corrects a clerical error in a federal reference.

17 5.) 635-041-0045

18 Authorize Sales in Yakama Nation Treaty Commercial Spring Tributary Fishery

19 Adopted: 5/12/2026 Effective Dates: 5/12/2026 through 6/15/2026

20 This amended rule authorizes the sale of fish caught in the Drano Lake permit fishery
21 enacted by the Yakama Nation from May 12-13, 2026. Modifications are consistent with
22 actions taken by the Departments of Fish and Wildlife for the States of Oregon and
23 Washington at a Columbia River Compact hearing on May 12, 2026.

25 6.) 635-023-0125

26 Set Days for the Recreational Spring Salmon Fishery in the Columbia River

27 Adopted: 5/14/2026 Effective Dates: 5/15/2026 through 6/15/2026

28 *This amended rule adds open days for the Columbia River recreational spring*
29 *salmon/steelhead fisheries downstream and upstream of Bonneville Dam and modifies the*
30 *daily bag limit regulation for Select Area recreational salmon fisheries through June 15.*
31 *Modifications are consistent with actions taken by the Departments of Fish and Wildlife for*
32 *the States of Oregon and Washington on May 12, 2026.*

35 Chair Wahl moved to ratify the six (6) temporary rules set forth in the May 15, 2026, agenda.

39 **2027-29 BUDGET DEVELOPMENT PROCESS**

40 The Commission was provided with an informational overview of the 2027-29 budget
41 development process, followed by time for Commissioners to ask questions and discuss
42 next steps.

4 Ken and Shaun provided the Commission with a presentation outlining the 2027–29 budget
5 development process, guided by Governor and DAS instructions to maintain core
6 operations, keep proposals budget-neutral, and self-fund General and Lottery Fund
7 packages. It highlights major Policy Option Packages focused on species resiliency,
8 infrastructure improvements, wildlife connectivity, stewardship, and implementation of HB
9 4134 to support recovery of Oregon’s at-risk species. Key investments include habitat
10 restoration, wildlife monitoring, partner-driven connectivity projects, and expanded research
11 and data capacity across ecosystems, hatchery resiliency. The presentation also reviewed
12 projected HB 4134 revenues, partner feedback emphasizing the need for capacity and data
13 investments, and upcoming milestones for commission review, public comment, and final
14 submission of the agency request budget.

17 **Winchester Water Control District-Request for Stay**

18 Action:

19 In response to a request received from the Winchester Water Control District on April 20th, 2026,
20 Commissioner Hall Defrees moved to issue an order to deny the Stay Request; Commissioner
21 Morrison seconded the motion, and the motion was carried six (6) in favor; Wahl, Hatfield-Hyde;
22 Labhart, Hall Defrees, Moldal, Morrison. One (1) Abstain; Spelbrink
