11 **Inclusions and Modifications**

12 (1) OAR 635-013-0005 through OAR 635-013-0009 modify or are in addition to provisions contained in  
13 Code of Federal Regulations, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H. Additional regulations may be  
14 adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the extent of any inconsistency they supersede the  
15 current annual Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations.

16 (2) The Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H, and the current annual  
17 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations contain requirements for sport salmon angling in the Pacific Ocean off  
18 the Oregon coast. However, additional regulations may be adopted from time to time, and, to the extent  
19 of any inconsistency, they supersede the published federal regulations and the current annual Oregon  
20 Sport Fishing Regulations. This means that persons must consult not only the federal regulations and the  
21 published sport fishing regulations but also the Department's web page to determine all applicable sport  
22 fishing regulations.

23 (3) This rule contains requirements that modify sport salmon angling regulations off the Oregon coast.  
24 The following modifications are organized in sections that apply to the ocean sport salmon fishery in  
25 general and within management zones established by the Pacific Fishery Management Council and  
26 enacted by Federal Regulations (CFR, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H).
