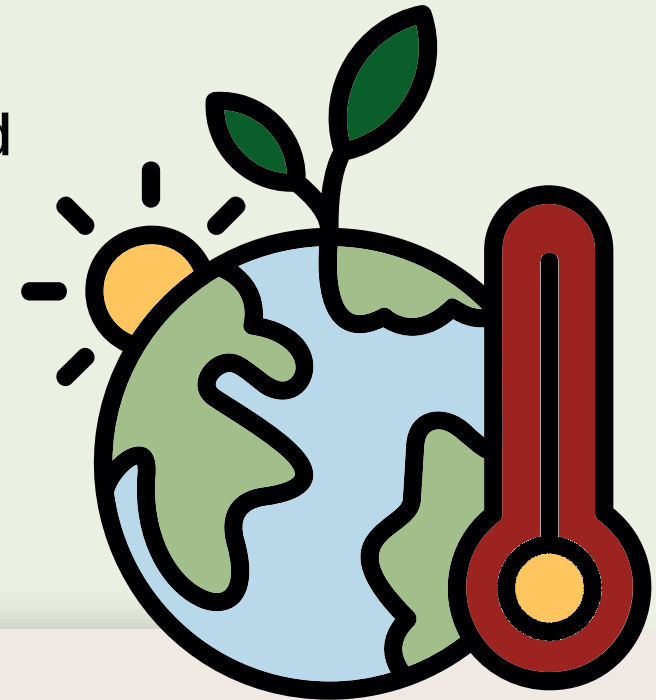

Fostering and Securing Resilient Lands and Waters

- Issued October 2025
- Goal of increasing coordination among state agencies to implement actions to mitigate and adapt to the impacts of a changing climate
- Sets climate resiliency as a shared north star to help Oregon's natural resource agencies align mandates, set priorities, and coordinate efforts.
